



The program targets the leadership of universities, colleges of education,

Rural Teachers Project

Believing in the girl's right to education and the need to provide equal opportunities for both sexes to obtain quality education, especially for girls in rural areas, the Rural Female Teachers Project was launched, which aims to enable rural girls to continue their university education with the aim of providing female teachers in general education schools in rural areas in Hadramout governorate providing job opportunities women to contribute to reducing poverty, the project was implemented in partnership with the Selah Foundation for Development and in coordination with Hadramout University and the implementation of the Teachers Training Institute, where a university center was opened in the Dawan district, which includes 184 girls in a bachelor's course in 4 educational specializations. The project also


included the rehabilitation of 21 girls in the Rakhiya area in the educational diploma course.


















Training for Empowerment Project

Our partnership with youth focuses on capacity-building to enhance youth employment opportunities to reduce unemployment and address poverty and marginalization. Al-Awn Foundation for Development has launched its "Training for Empowerment" project to provide trainees with skills that qualify them to enter the labor market, and give them the opportunity to improve their social and economic standard of living. The project relied on Two components are empowering

graduates and enhancing the capabilities of technical institutes. The first component focused on training in the disciplines required in the labor market through direct training in external companies and institutions in the same field, while the second component focused on opening three new training areas for young people in the Industrial Vocational Institute in Mukalla and Seiyun By training teachers and equipping departments with the equipment needed for training.


Over the past two years, Al-Awn Foundation for Development has implemented a behavioral life project to increase the community's resilience to confront the Corona pandemic that shook the corners of the world as a whole through electronic awareness campaigns, webinars, posters, production of knowledge guides, competitions, and Arkoun community (the first digital self-learning community in Yemen) in health aspects Public and personal hygiene and self-learning. These campaigns have reached more than 40 million visits in 14 countries. The project focused on building knowledge that generates behavior that reduces the burden of diseases resulting from wrong behaviors and lack of hygiene and ensures that everyone enjoys healthy lifestyles and well-being at all ages. . The project encouraged young men and women to engage in voluntary work in various areas covered by the project's activities. The participation of all groups of different ages and genders in the project's activities played a major role in achieving the project's objectives, which seek to support the health and wellbeing of the community.

Operation and development of Al-Hajrain Cooperative Hospital (primary health care) project

Primary health care is the key to achieving health for all Based on the Astana Declaration of 2018, which emphasizes the need to achieve a level of health for all people in order to make them productive people in society, for this reason, the Foundation launched in the city of Hajrin the primary health care project aimed at providing health care services that These include improving reproductive, maternal child health, and ending infectious diseases: Reducing non-communicable diseases, and oral and dental health services. The project works to enhance environmental health aspects and spread knowledge about health aspects among members of the community. It builds the capabilities

of the health cadres in the center in order to respond effectively to people's health needs in a timely and appropriate manner. The project works to create an electronic medical file. And to monitor the health of individuals through mobile messages, and we will work to build effective partnerships with the Ministry of Health and all concerned parties.




School Health Promotion Project (Back to Learnig Campaign)

Al-Awn Foundation for Development is working with the Ministry of Education to secure a safe return for students in light of fears of the spread of the Covid 19 virus among students and coinciding with the start of the academic year 20212022/ to ensure that all children have access to education and benefit from educational Foundation opportunities, the has adopted a health promotion project schools in 43 schools in 3 governorates to provide health protection for children in their

schools, as the project worked to provide health materials from which 59,718 male and female students benefited











A project to develop the Al-Hajerin water project (water production by solar energy)

Today, more than 15,000 people in the historic city of Al-Hajrin and its environs in Hadramout Governorate have access to clean. potable water at all times, after they had suffered from limited access to it. Where the Hajrain water project was rehabilitated, which comes to enhance the resilience of rural communities and in line with the sixth goal of the sustainable development goals. The project was launched in 2016 after conducting a comprehensive study of the needs of the region. The project included four phases. The fourth phase was completed in 2021. During the project, 4 artesian wells were drilled. (The productivity of the four wells is 155 cubic meters per hour), pumps operated by the

solar energy system were installed, 3 tanks with a capacity of 1300 cubic meters were constructed, a total of 27057.3 meters of water pipes were installed, and water meters were installed to ensure the continued availability of potable water in homes.

Urgent relief project for the flood disaster in Tarim

In the aftermath of the torrential disaster in the city of Tarim and declaring it a disaster area, the rapid response of Al-Awn Foundation for Development three through urgent was interventions in shelter, health, and environmental sanitation (clearing the flood sewers), where we were able to reach 1.320 affected people, and provide non-food assistance to them, and during the project 3 mist spraying campaigns were implemented to prevent the spread of mosquitoes, and within the third component of the project, the rehabilitation of the secondary streams that were damaged by the torrential torrents.
